A MESSAGE FROM COUNCIL MEMBER GALLAGHER

The Phi Alpha Theta chapter at Boston College is headed-up by faculty advisor María de los Ángeles Picone, a Latin Americanist who specializes in borderlands, migrant, and spatial history. She is particularly interested in the history of Chile and Argentina in Northern Patagonia. Angie energetically leads Phi Alpha Theta

students to promote induction of new students into the chapter each year. The Boston College chapter holds an annual induction ceremony in the fall semester for new members and elects officers annually. Phi Alpha Theta members collaborate with Professor Picone and Professor Charles R. Gallagher, SJ, a member of the PAT National Council, to organize various other activities. The Boston College chapter also confers an annual award for excellence in teaching to a member of the history faculty.

Professor Picone is popular among our students as an early adopter of the "Unessay" style of assessment in her classes. In this style of learning assessment, instead of submitting an exam, the student submits a stand-alone, original project that exhibits a breadth of learning on a particular topic or theme. One popular Unessay method that Professor Picone's students have taken up is the group creation of a board game connected to a historical theme or subject. This lays out course material in a fun recall and content-driven style.

Unessay projects also could be a painting, a video of a culinary creation, a quilt, or a craft project on a historical theme. For these more singular and independent projects, there is a twist. Each of these projects requires a 3-page reflection paper. Reflection is a central element of student formation at Boston College and is grounded in the Jesuit spiritual concept of "discernment." The reflection element is aimed at connecting the content of the course materials with larger values and principles.

Professor Charles Gallagher, S.J. has moved toward writing on the intersection of religion and intelligence studies. In his 2021 book Nazis of Copley Square: The Forgotten History of the Christian Front, Gallagher uncovered Nazi, British, and Soviet spy activity in Boston. During the warm-weather months, he takes Phi Alpha Theta students and others on a "Walking Spy Tour of Boston," visiting a secret British short wave radio station, the former headquarters of a Nazi front organization, the Boston headquarters of the British MI6 operation intended to thwart the Nazi threat, and also the former German consulate on Beacon Hill. In the fall of 2023, Gallagher intends to organize a PAT student visit to the Nathan Hale homestead in Coventry Connecticut. While the PAT chapter at Boston College is growing, it is also hoping to become more visible on campus and among all BC students who study in this epicenter of history, the cradle of the Revolution, and the city once known as "the Athens of America."
